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Appendix 1: Questionnaire

1. Methodology

This survey was conducted using EKOS' probability-based panel, *Probit*. *Probit* offers complete coverage of the Canadian population (i.e., Internet, phone, cell phone), random recruitment (in other words, participants are recruited randomly, they do not opt themselves into our panel), and equal probability sampling. All respondents to our panel are recruited by telephone using random digit dialling (RDD) and are confirmed by live interviews. Survey results from our panel are generalizable to the broader Canadian population and allow for margins of error to be associated with results.

The field dates for this survey were July 9-16, 2026. In total, a random sample of 1,512 Ontario residents, aged 18 and over responded to the survey. The margin of error associated with the total sample is +/- 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Please note that the margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided (i.e., for sub-groups such as region, gender and age). All the data have been statistically weighted to ensure the sample's composition reflects that of the actual population of Ontario.

Note that due to rounding, figures may not add up to 100 per cent.

2. Detailed results

2.1 SUPPORT FOR PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION

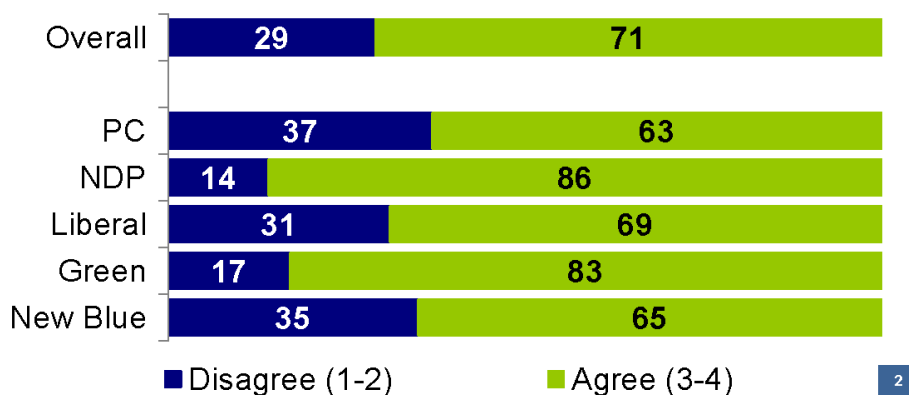
Results of the survey show that seven-in-ten (71 per cent) of Ontarians agree that the percentage of seats in the provincial legislature should match the percentage won in the popular vote. Respondents were specifically given the example of “if an Ontario provincial party gets 40% of the popular vote, they should get about 40% of the seats in the legislature”, avoiding the term “proportional representation” to avoid recent politicization of the term. The remaining 29 per cent of Ontarians disagree that the percentage of seats won in an election should match votes on in the popular vote. Respondents were not given the option of skipping the question, forcing them to decide in which direction they leant.

- Young people (under 35) are slightly more likely to agree (75 per cent) than seniors (66 per cent) that seats won in an election should match the popular vote.
- University educated Ontarians are more likely (74 per cent) to support proportional representation than those with a high school education (68 per cent).
- NDP (86 per cent) and Green Party (83 per cent) supporters are significantly more likely to agree that party seat totals should match their popular vote than supporters of the other two main parties, especially Progressive Conservatives (63 per cent).
- Most non-voters back the principle of proportional representation, with 86 per cent of those who did not vote in the 2025 provincial election agreeing that if a party gets 40% of the vote, they should get 40% of the seats.

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2.2 SUPPORT FOR CROSS-PARTY ELECTORAL REFORM

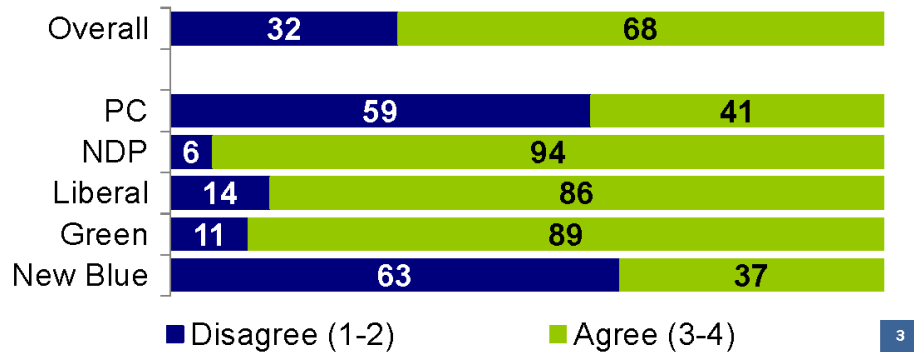
Respondents were informed that the most common way electoral reform is achieved is with an agreement among several parties. Respondents were asked if they agreed or disagreed with the statement “The Ontario Liberal Party, Ontario NDP and the Green Party of Ontario should work together to come to an agreement on a more proportional electoral system before the next provincial election”. Two-thirds (68 per cent) of Ontarians agree with this notion, while just one-third (32 per cent) disagree.

- Women (74 per cent) are much more likely than men (63 per cent) to support the three opposition parties working together to push for electoral reform.
- Three-quarters (75 per cent) of those with a university education believe the three parties should work together, while only three-fifths (60 per cent) of college educated Ontarians agree.
- Another three-quarters (75 per cent) of those living in Toronto believe the three parties should work together for electoral reform, while opposition is highest in Northern Ontario where only 57 per cent agree.
- New Democrats are near unanimous (94 per cent) in their support for the three opposition parties working together for proportional representation. A very large proportion of Liberal Party (86 per cent) and Green Party (89 per cent) supporters also agree that the parties should work together. Not surprisingly, Tories tend to not agree, with only two-fifths (41 per cent) believing that the other parties should work together to come to an agreement on electoral reform. New Blue Party supporters are even less likely to agree, with just 37 per cent believing the parties should work together.

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2.3 IMPACTS OF ELECTORAL REFORM ON TURNOUT

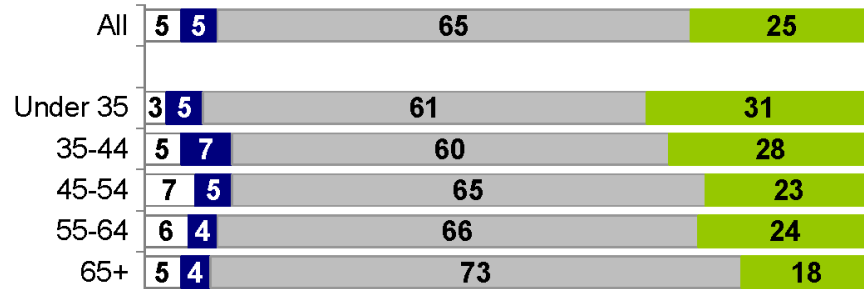
Survey results reveal that two-thirds (65 per cent) of Ontarians do not believe that the three opposition parties coming to an agreement and presenting a shared proposal during the next election campaign to bring in a more proportional voting system would affect their likelihood of voting in the next election. However, one quarter (25 per cent) say it would make them more likely to vote in the next provincial election, while only a small number (5 per cent) say it would make them less likely. Another five per cent don't know or prefer not to answer.

- Women (69 per cent) are more likely than men (61 per cent) to say that an agreement on a proportional voting system would not impact their likelihood of voting in the next election. Nearly one-third (30 per cent) of men say an agreement would make them more likely to vote compared to just one-in-five (21 per cent) of women.
- Young people (those under 35) are much more likely to say an agreement between the opposition parties on proportional representation would increase their likelihood of voting in the next election compared to seniors (those over 65). One-third (31 per cent) of young people say they are more likely to vote compared to just 18 per cent of seniors.
- University educated Ontarians are also more likely to vote if the parties come to an agreement, with one-third (31 per cent) saying this. Just one-in-five (22 per cent) of both high school and college educated Ontarians say they are more likely to vote in this scenario.
- About one-third of residents of Eastern Ontario (29 per cent) Toronto (33 per cent) are more likely to vote if the parties came to an agreement on proportional representation, significantly more than other parts of the province. Residents of Southwestern Ontario (20 per cent) and Northern Ontario (16 per cent) are particularly less likely to be persuaded.
- A significant number (11 per cent) of lower-income Ontarians (those whose household incomes are less than \$50,000) say they would be less likely to vote in the next election if the opposition parties made an agreement on proportional representation. Those making between \$100,000 and \$160,000 are significantly more likely to vote (31 per cent) in this scenario.
- Over two-fifths of would-be Green (44 per cent) and NDP voters (40 per cent) say they are more likely to vote if their parties worked with the Liberals to share a proportional representation proposal in the next election. A significant number (11 per cent) of New Blue Party supporters and Progressive Conservatives (7 per cent) are less likely to vote. A significant number (13 per cent) of undecided voters are also less likely to vote in this scenario. Seven-in-ten (70 per cent) Tories and Liberals would be equally as likely to vote.
- While undecided voters would not be persuaded by the opposition parties working together, half (49 per cent) of non-voters would be more likely to vote in the next election if the opposition parties came

together and presented a shared proposal in the next election to bring in a more proportional voting system.
